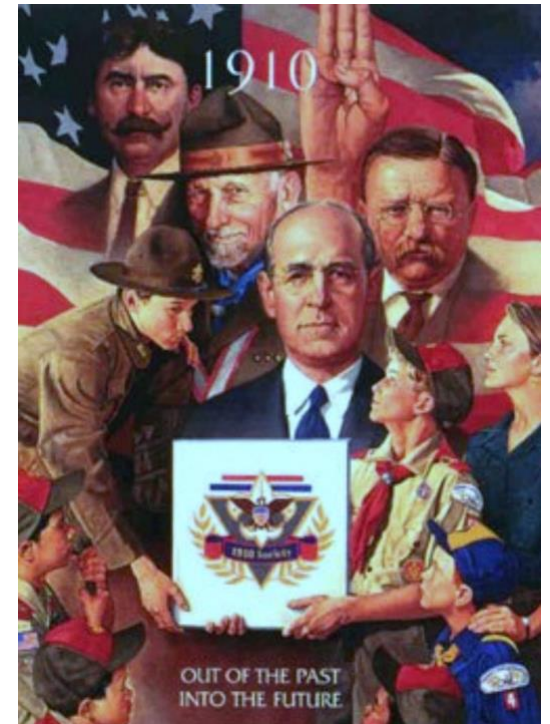
OUR PRIORITY

As liaison between the local Council and Scouting Units, the Commissioner's mission is to keep assigned Units operating at maximum efficiency. The Commissioner maintains regular contact with the leaders of the Units, counsels them on where to find assistance, notes any weaknesses in programs, and suggests remedies.



WHAT DO THEY DO?

Roundtable Commissioner: presents info to unit leaders at Roundtables.

Unit Commissioner: contacts and visits units to help them in any way they might ask.

- They are the units' friends, NOT judges.
- They seek for the unit to operate at its peak ability.
- They are sources of information.
- They can help unit leaders navigate troubles of ANY kind.

District Commissioner: manages the above.
