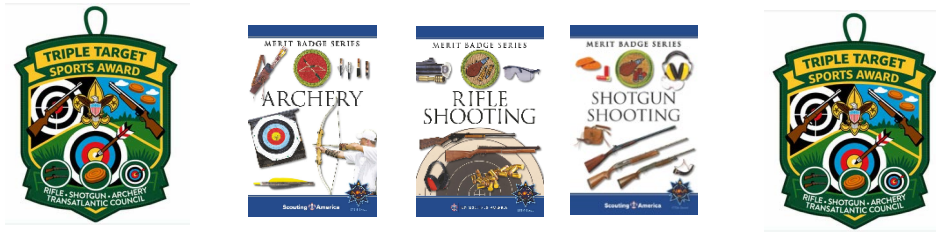


Transatlantic Council Triple Target Sports Award



Requirements

Earn the Transatlantic Council's **Triple Target Sports Award** by:

1. Earning these merit badges:

Archery

Date Earned:

The history of the Archery merit badge dates back to its introduction by the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) in 1911. Initially, the BSA issued 57 merit badges, including the Archery badge, which was designed to teach Scouts about the sport of archery, safety rules, and the history of archery. The Archery merit badge helps Scouts develop skills in using a bow and arrow, essential for hitting targets, and encourages patience and persistence.

The Rifle Shooting Merit Badge dates back to the early 20th century, when the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) began offering merit badges in 1911. The rifle shooting merit badge was

Shotgun Shooting

Date Earned:

The Shotgun Shooting merit badge was introduced to teach Scouts basic skills in using a shotgun safely and effectively. It includes topics such as the development of the muzzleloading shotgun, safe handling rules, and the proper use of black powder. The badge emphasizes the importance of responsible gun handling and the connection between hunting and the wise use of wildlife resources

2. Completing one or more of these projects:
 - a. Teach an Archery, Rifle Shooting or Shotgun Shooting merit badge skill to your troop, crew or ship as part of a unit program activity.
 - b. Help instruct Cub Scouts on BB Gun, Slingshot or Archery adventures as part of a Council/ District Cub Scout Range Activity.
 - c. Participate in an Archery, Rifle, or Shotgun tournament, either at a Scouting or Community event.
